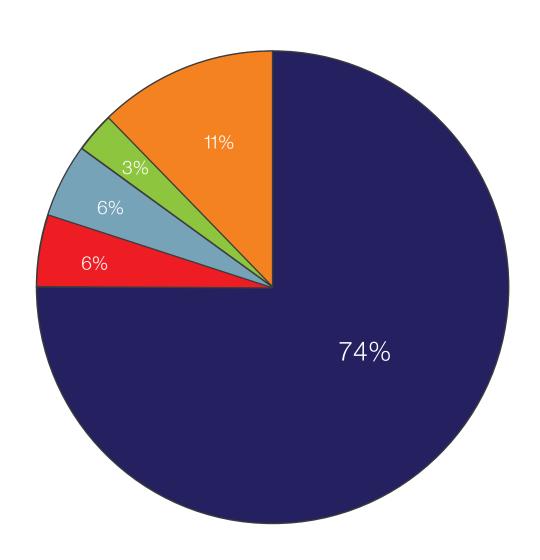




Where Our Money is Spent
